Canton Union School District is dedicated to providing a safe learning environment for our students and staff. We have worked diligently to ensure the disruptions caused by COVID are minimized as much as possible. Our focus remains not only on empowering every student to embrace their individuality, but to ensure that every student is prepared, respectful, driven, and empowered to pursue their future. This communication provides updated details on the policies and procedures related to COVID. Given the frequent changes and unpredictability of the situation, CUSD 66 will continue to provide timely updates to families and community members. We thank you for your unwavering support.

Remote Learning

Remote learning will continue to be offered to any student who is absent from school due to issues related to COVID.

Masks

Mask use is optional indoors and on busses.

Exclusion

Students and staff who have symptoms of infectious illness, such as influenza (flu) or COVID19, should stay home and contact their healthcare provider for testing and care.

Any student who has tested positive for COVID will be excluded from school for 5 days.

Screening

Screening will take place as indicated with the changes of mitigation levels. This may include self-certification badges as well as temperature screening.

Covid Testing

Students and staff will be able to participate in free weekly COVID testing.

Band and Choir

At this time, music programs will continue all regular programming including competitions, concerts, and programs. This may be altered to a virtual format or may be cancelled if additional mitigation measures must be taken.



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Field Trips and Assemblies

Pending administrative approval, field trips that align with instructional outcomes and/or are in extension of the learning environment will be permitted.

Disabilities or Other Health Care Needs

Parents of students who need accommodations, modifications, or assistance related to COVID-19 safety protocols, disabilities, underlying medical conditions, or weakened immune systems should contact their student's case manager to discuss those need(s).

Staff members who need accommodations, modifications, or assistance related to COVID-19 safety protocols, disabilities, underlying medical conditions, or weakened immune systems should contact the district superintendent to discuss the need(s). Staff members with weakened immune systems are advised to contact their healthcare professional about the need for continued personal protective measures after vaccination.

Handwashing and Respiratory Etiquette

School staff will monitor and reinforce frequent handwashing and respiratory etiquette by:

- Continuing to teach handwashing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds;
- Assisting young children with handwashing;
 - reminding everyone in the facility to wash hands frequently;
- Using hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol (for teachers, staff, and older students who can safely use hand sanitizer) when handwashing is not possible;
- Continuing to teach respiratory etiquette (e.g., covering coughs and sneezes).

Vaccination Clinics

Those who want to get vaccinated against COVID-19 can visit [vaccines.gov](https://www.vaccines.gov) or contact the Fulton County Health Department to find out where they can get vaccinated in our community. Canton Union School District #66 will continue to partner with the Fulton County Health Department to provide vaccination opportunities.

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MITIGATION LEVELS

LEVEL 1- MINIMAL

Metric- Past 7 days of new positive cases per school (staff and students) is 0-1% for two consecutive weeks



- Masks are optional for all students, staff, and visitors
- Provide remote learning to qualifying students

LEVEL 2-MODERATE

Metric- Past 7 days of new positive cases per school (staff and students) is 1.01-3.0% for two consecutive weeks



- Masks are optional for all students, staff, and visitors
- Close contact and symptomatic students may be recommended to quarantine
- Provide remote learning to qualifying students and/or implement remote learning for classes, grade level or building if needed
- Field trips, assemblies, and some programs may be canceled or postponed

LEVEL 3-SUBSTANTIAL

Metric- Past 7 days of new positive cases per school (staff and students) is > 3.01% for two consecutive weeks



- Masks may be recommended for all students and staff at all times
- 3 feet to 6 feet of distance will be maintained between individuals when possible
- Close contact and symptomatic students may be recommended to quarantine
- Provide remote learning to qualifying students and/or implement remote learning for classes, grade level or building if needed
- Screening and temperature may be required for entry
- Field trips, assemblies, and some programs may be canceled or postponed
- Visitors may be required to provide proof of vaccination
